What you need to know Before you visit the Retirement Residence

- 1) I have self-screened, and I am not feeling unwell.
- 2) I do not live or work in an area of the province that is in greater restrictions (as identified by the provincial COVID-19 zones) than the area where the Retirement Residence is located.
- 3) I have a scheduled visit appointment at the Retirement Residence.
- 4) I have a surgical/procedural mask that I will wear the entire visit, and I am aware that I must maintain physical distancing at all times.
- 5) I am not bringing any items or gifts that can't tolerate being disinfected.
- 6) I am not visiting with more than one resident during this scheduled visit.
- 7) I am not with more than one other visitor for the same scheduled visit. (i.e. visits are limited to 2 people at a time)
- 8) I am able to arrive in advance of my scheduled visit to allow for active screening and education.
- 9) I will leave at the end of my scheduled visit on time to allow for proper disinfecting prior to the next visitor.
- 10) I have reviewed the updated Visitor Policy, changed effective October 13, 2020.
- 11) I have reviewed the Public Health Ontario document, "Recommended Steps; Putting On Personal Protective Equipment", and "Recommended Steps; Taking Off Personal Protective Equipment" which has been provided with the Visitor Policy. This must be done at minimum every 30 days.
- 12) I have watched all 3 of the Public Health Ontario videos as required:

These videos must be watched prior to your first visit, and at minimum every 30 days thereafter.

- 13) I am aware that if the Retirement Residence should go into outbreak, all general visits will be cancelled.
- 14) I am aware that, should the area in which the Retirement home is located be designated by Public Health as a High Alert area, all visits may be cancelled, and other restrictions may be imposed by Public Health.
